The Korean Association for the Study of Intestinal Diseases (KASID) has initiated the first International Multi-society Online Case conference for Intestinal Diseases (IMOTICON) on the 21st of August, 2021, and has been continuing the academic exchange among the intestinal disease researchers in Pacific Asia since then.

The IMOTICON would allow young Asian researchers to share their treatment experiences for the diseases of interest, and increase further understanding on the latest medical conditions of each country. It would be an opportunity to enhance acquaintance among researchers in the Asia-Pacific region, which would facilitate the formation of new research projects. So, we believe that the IMOTICON activates online discussion and will strengthen sense of fellowship among emerging researchers of intestinal disease in the Asia-Pacific region.


The 9th IMOTICON

The 9th IMOTICON was held on July 25th, 2023. A total of 175 attendees from 7 countries expanded clinical experience with wonderful cases presented by four outstanding speakers at the IMOTICON. Prof. Dong-Hoon Yang hosted the online conference as moderator, and Dr. Jihun Kim and Dr. Jong Keon Jang participated as panelists providing expert consultations on pathology and imaging findings and actively discussed the cases with the speakers and audience.
